#### Dear Parents.

We have had a great start to Term 1 and can't believe we're almost at the end of term already! The children have adapted to being together again so quickly and it's great to see them having fun in the playground!

Following the latest advice from the Scottish Government, school restrictions are to remain in place until at least the October holidays. Thank you for your ongoing patience and understanding with this, but we do need to remind you to be kind and respectful to one another around the school gate, allowing other parents and children to move around safely and freely.

#### **Procedures**

A wee reminder that with the exception of children who travel by school bus, pupils are the responsibility of their parents before the 9am bell. We also ask, now that the weather is colder, that all children come to school appropriately dressed and with a coat on a daily basis. We try to get children outside in all weathers and outdoor learning plays an important part in what we do.

Those coming to school with bikes/scooters must also disembark at the gate and walk them across to the bike shed. Thank you.

## MacMillan Coffee Morning

Despite restrictions, we were determined that nothing stops a coffee morning! P7 and Miss Simpson did a brilliant job of organising and running their McMillan Coffee Morning last Friday! ## Pupil Illness

A few points to remember regarding pupil illness:

## Sickness/diarrhoea

Please remember that children must remain at home if they have sickness/diarrhoea and should only return to school 48 hours after the last episode.

#### Cold/sniffles

Children are able to attend school with a cold unless they are feeling very unwell within themselves or have Covid 19 symptoms. Tissues are available in all classrooms.

## Covid 19 symptoms

Children should remain at home and access a PCR test if they have any of the 3 main Covid 19 symptoms - a persistent cough, loss/change of sense of taste/smell or a temperature. All household members should remain at home until a negative test result has been received then they can return to school provided they are asymptomatic. If we have a positive Covid case in school, whole classes are no longer asked to isolate. Schools now send out 'Warn and Inform' letters with further guidance and those identified as close contacts are contacted directly by Test and Trace.

Please note that the guidance on this changes on a very regular basis and families are encouraged to test regularly using lateral flow devices which are available to order online.

#### **Parking**

We remind all parents to be considerate and not to park over neighbouring driveways. Please, where possible, park away from the school and walk the remainder of the way. Thank you for your cooperation.

## School Photographs

Tempest Photography will be in school on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November to take individual and family (those who live in the same household) photographs. All children will be required to come to school wearing uniform that day – there will be no PE.

Unfortunately, due to restrictions with people entering the building, we will be unable to accommodate siblings who do not currently attend our school. Thank you.
