Dear Parents,

Welcome to Term 3! We hope that you all had a lovely Christmas and New Year with your loved ones despite Covid restrictions. On behalf of the staff, thank you for your many kind gifts.

The latest guidance from the Scottish Government for schools was received just at the end of term. As a result, we have now had to reintroduce 'bubbles' indoors only and a separate letter has been issued regarding this. Please remember, that if anyone in your household tests positive, all household members must self isolate for 10 days, regardless of age or negative PCR result. You must also keep us informed if anyone has Covid symptoms or tests positive.

We are thankful though that our Covid numbers are still relatively low in comparison to some of our cluster schools - thank you for your help in ensuring that we keep everyone safe

PIMS TS

I am continuing to raise awareness of Paediatric Inflammatory Multisystem Syndrome which can affect children after having had Covid 19. Please be vigilant if your child becomes poorly after having had Covid.



<u>Clothing</u>

The weather is turning much colder and it is important that children come to school appropriately dressed. We still see some children wearing shorts and coming to school not wearing jackets and think that they must be feeling the cold! Please bear in mind that we have to keep classroom windows open to stop the spread of infection so classrooms can be colder than usual.

All children must bring jumpers and jackets daily. Additional items such as gloves etc must also be named. Thank you.

<u>Christmas</u>

We hope that you all enjoyed our virtual Christmas concert - 'Straw and Order.' Thank you so much to our staff team for putting this together and to Scott Cassie for filming it for us.

<u>Pupil Illness</u>

A few points to remember regarding pupil illness:

<u>Sickness/diarrhoea</u>

Please remember that children must remain at home if they have sickness/diarrhoea and should only return to school 48 hours after the last episode.

<u>Cold/sniffles</u>

Children are able to attend school with a cold unless they are feeling very unwell within themselves or have Covid 19 symptoms. Tissues are available in all classrooms but we would always appreciate donations of more please. Thank you.

Covid 19 symptoms

Children should remain at home and access a PCR test if they have any of the 3 main Covid 19 symptoms - a persistent cough, loss/change of sense of taste/smell or a temperature. Guidance has now changed, so that if anyone in your household tests positive, the whole household must self isolate for 10 days even if they have been double vaccinated or had a negative test. If we have a positive Covid case in school, whole classes are no longer asked to isolate. Schools now send out 'Warn and Inform' letters with further guidance. Please be vigilant for the latest and most dominant strain of Covid 19 - Omicron.

<u>Parking</u>

We remind all parents to be considerate and not to park over neighbouring driveways. Please, where possible, park away from the school and walk the remainder of the way. Thank you for your cooperation.

Adverse Weather

Please familiarise yourself with the Adverse weather information at the bottom of this newsletter. In the event of school closures due to increment weather, a message will be left on the school closure line as soon as possible in the morning and information will be available on the Aberdeenshire Council website. If a closure happens at short notice during the day, we will send out a text first. These are the only approved methods used by Aberdeenshire Council.
