Whilst you may be wondering why some schools are remaining open, this is because not all members of staff have opted to strike.


Whilst we apologise for any inconvenience caused, we have tried to give you as much notice as possible and should the situation change, we will be in touch to let you know.

<u>Parking</u>


We remind all parents to be considerate and not to park over neighbouring driveways. Please, where possible, park away from the school and walk the remainder of the way. Thank you for your cooperation.
