#### <u>The Bud Bus</u>

In May we had a visit from the Poppy Scotland team who brought their Bud Bus—I am sure you all saw it in the playground. Every class got an opportunity to go out to the bus with their teacher. On board were two representatives— Laura and John who taught the children about the history of Poppy Scotland, the factory they have in Edinburgh and stories from a variety of people involved in the charity. The bus itself was amazing with display cases showing how the poppy, collection tins, wreaths and crosses have changed over the years. Children and staff all got the opportunity to make their own Poppy on board Bud and learned how to clock in and out from the factory.
